Authors Talk in September at Wilton Library

Wilton, CT – From child nurturing to the celebration of cooking to the interconnected lives of two sisters, Wilton Library covers a great deal of ground with three author talks scheduled for September.

At the start of the month, Po Bronson, an award-winning science journalist arrives on Tuesday, Sept. 1, from noon – 1:30 p.m. to discuss his work, *NurtureShock*. His talk covers modern society's strategies for nurturing children and how they are backfiring. Kare Anderson, Emmy-winning former *Wall Street Journal* reporter writes in her blog, “From the real root cause of obesity to where the worst bullying really happens, this book is a wake-up call for parents and anyone involved with schools or children. I’m betting it will spark some excited – and heated conversations.” Bronson and his co-author Ashley Merryman’s *New York Magazine* articles on the science of parenting won the magazine journalism award from the American Association for the Advancement of Science and a Clarion Award. Their articles for **Time** magazine have won the award for outstanding journalism from the Council on Contemporary Families. Prior to collaborating with Merryman, Bronson authored five books, including the #1 *New York Times* bestseller *What Should I Do With My Life?* The program is co-sponsored by the Wilton League of Women Voters and Wilton Library.

Wiltonian Andy Pforzheimer talks about his new cookbook, *The Barcelona Cookbook: A Celebration of Food Wine and Life* on Thursday, September 10, from 7 – 8:30 p.m. The local chef and restaurant developer of the Barcelona Restaurant and Wine Bar group talks about his life as a chef and his experiences at world-renowned cooking locations in France, California and New York City, and the development of his new cookbook, undertaken with his partner Sasa Mahr-Batuz, a native of Argentina.

Julia Glass, best-selling author of *Three Junes*, comes to Wilton Library on Wednesday,

Sept. 16, from 7 – 8:30 p.m. to discuss her new fiction, *I See You Everywhere*. The book is a tale of two sisters told in alternating voices over 25 years and deals with life and death, compassion and sorrow and sisterhood. A starred review from *Booklist* states, “In her third exquisite, piercing novel, National Book Award winner Glass juxtaposes the temperamentally opposite Jardine sisters... Glass is a wisely questioning, ardent, and artful novelist.”
